

Dimensions of national culture

Hofstede's (1980) dimensions of national culture

- Power Distance: the extent to which the less powerful members of society accept that power is distributed unequally.
- Individualism vs. Collectivism: distinguishes cultures that value individual effort over the collective work.
- Masculinity in a society denotes assertiveness, contrasted to the femininity associated to modest behaviour .
- Uncertainty Avoidance: the extent to which the members of a culture feel threatened by ambiguous or unknown situation.
- Long-Term Orientation stands for fostering of virtues toward future rewards, in particular perseverance and thrift.

Value Survey Module-94 by Hofstede (1994) applied in the survey we conducted in 09/2014 at 1500 Croatian citizens







Measuring privacy concern

- "Privacy survey" we have conducted at 500 Croatian citizens (Budak et al. 2013)
- 3 items from the questionnaire, related to the individual level of on-line privacy concern used:
- Information I send over the Internet (e-mail, Facebook and other) could be misused.
- The usage of computers and ICT increases the possibility of personal data manipulation.
- I am concerned with the volume of personal information and data stored on computers that might be misused.
- Online privacy concern index PRICON constructed







Croatian society set of values

Measure	Description	Range	Value
PDI	Hofstede's Power Distance Index	0-100	41
IDV	Hofstede's Individualism Index	0-100	68
MAS	Hofstede's Masculinity Index	0-100	14
UAI	Hofstede's Uncertainty Avoidance Index	0-100	88
LTO	Hofstede's Long-term Orientation index	0-100	45
PRICON	Online Privacy Concern Index	1-5	4.26



Results-groups of counties



High online privacy concern: long-term oriented counties with strong power distance, less masculinity and less individualism **Low** online privacy concern: weak power distance and short-term orientation in combination with collectivism Counties with higher levels of individualism and masculinity tend to have about average levels of on-line privacy concern.







Conclusions and future research

- national culture matters for the on-line privacy concern
- we will proceed with including some dimensions in the model as antecedents of online privacy concern, e.g.
- Hofstede's Power Distance and Long-term Orientation
- alternative measures of culture might be used instead of Hofstede's
